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Introduction

The Palestinian Central Bureau of Statistics (PCBS) has carried out the first national wage structure and work hours survey between 15/01/2007 and 21/3/2007. The survey provides detailed data on wages structure and work hours for use in policy research. The main objectives of this survey are:

- Providing comprehensive data on earnings, paid working hours, and the actually working hours.
- Providing information on the regulations in the payment of wages in the economic establishments and their applications.
- Providing data on the number of permanent or\and temporary employees in establishments operating in the private and civic sectors, and the different characteristics in terms of economic activity, occupation, sex, etc.
- Providing data on worker's compensation in terms of salaries, wages and benefits and other benefits in kind by economic activity, sex, etc.
- Providing data on the paid working hours, paid holidays by economic activity, occupation and sex.
- A base to start the installation of index components of salaries and wages by economic activity, occupation and sex.

Methodology

The instruments were designed following the ILO recommendations for wage structure and work hours. These recommendations follow the concept of National Accounts (SNA 1993). The main concepts are summarized as follows:

- A random strata sample from establishments operating in both private and civic sectors which at least employing five employees.
- Comprehensive enumeration for establishments that at least employing twenty employees and above
- In addition the central government establishments and institutions (ministries, hospitals, schools, etc.), the agricultural, international and foreign establishments were excluded from the survey.

The Ouestionnaire

The wages and work hours' questionnaire consists of four main parts:

- Part 1: Data from the established tariff items and the quality control.
- Part 2: General data on the establishment and its policy, established year, the number of actual working months, work injuries insurance, the payment mechanism of wages and salaries, the average weekly working hours, the main method used to be established for the training of new employees, establishment contribution in the provision of health insurance, and providing services for employees with such financial facilities, housing, transportation, nursery, etc.
- Part 3: this section covers all establishments operation twenty employees and over during October 2006. This section includes data on the type of occupations available in the establishment, the total number of employees per each occupation by sex, employment character (permanent\ temporary), employment type (full-time\ part-time), wages limits, and data on regular working hours per each occupation for full-time employees.
- Part 4: This section includes data on employment characteristics during October 2006. This section provides data on the socio-economic indicators of the employees, (age, sex, marital

status, educational level, occupation, employment period, type of work, regular wages and salaries, paid working hours, benefits, etc..). Employees, working in the establishment which operating five employees, were comprehensive enumerated, while a simple random sample was chosen from establishments which operating twenty employees or\ and more.

The Sample and the Frame

The target establishments in this sample survey comprises all establishments operating in both private and civic sectors, excluding agricultural, international and foreign establishments in addition to governmental institutions and establishments.

The survey sample consists of about 1,773 establishments were interviewed, of which 1,149 establishments in the West Bank and 624 establishments in Gaza Strip.

Data Processing

Both data entry and tabulation were performed using the ACCESS and SPSS software programs. Data entry was organized into three files, corresponding to the main parts of the questionnaire. A data entry template was designed to reflect an exact image of the questionnaire, and included various electronic checks, logical checks, range checks, consistency checks and cross-validation. Manual inspection of results was completed, and any field-related errors were returned to the source for corrections.

Main Findings

This chapter presents a summary of the main indicators of wage structure and working hours survey, 2006. These indicators show the main characteristics of wages/ salaries and compensations level in the Palestinian labour market.

Wage Employees on November 2006:

- The number of wage employees in the establishment employed 5 and above employees in the Palestinian territory reached 82,482 employee; 56,695 in the West Bank and 25,786 employee in Gaza Strip.
- The results showed that 96.5% of wage employees worked full time; 96.1% of males and 97.5% of females (96.2% in the West Bank and 97.2% in Gaza Strip) compared with 3.5% worked in part time jobs; 3.9% of males and 2.5% of females (3.8% in the West Bank and 2.8% in the Gaza Strip).

Services and privileges provided to employees

- 68.4% of the national private sector establishments operating in the Palestinian Territory, provides their employees with work injuries insurance compared to 41.5% of civic sector establishments, while 75.3% of the national private enterprises provide employment contracts to the employees against 89.7% of the civic sector establishments.
- 54.1% of private national establishments provides compensation and severance payments, compared with 67.7% in the civic sector establishments.
- 45.8% of the national private sector establishments granted annual paid vacation compared with 63.3% in the civic sector establishments.
- 53.7% of the national private sector establishments granted sick vacations for employees, compared with 73.2% in the civic sector establishments.
- 69.8% of the national private sector establishments granted paid holidays, compared with 89.2% in the civic sector establishments

Wages Rates, November 2006

- The wage of the salaried employees in the Palestinian territory stood at 516 US\$ in November 2006; of which US\$ 750 in the West Bank and US\$ 411 in Gaza Strip.
- At the economic activity level, the highest limit of the average wage of the salaried employees was paid for employees working in the financial intermediation sector, (US\$ 847 in November 2006 of which US\$ 875 in the West Bank and US\$ 742 in Gaza Strip), followed by the construction sector, US\$ 647 of which US\$ 780 in the West Bank and US\$ 559 in Gaza Strip, followed by the rental real-estate activities US\$ 645 of which US\$ 793 in the West Bank and US\$ 479 in Gaza Strip. (596 US\$ of males and 398 of females).
- The wages of salaried employees working as legislators and senior officials occupations the average reached raised the highest value of wages in November 2006 (US\$ 1,030) of which US\$ 1,176 in the West Bank and US\$ 763 in the Gaza Strip),

- while the employees in service, shop and market worker occupations registered the lowest rate at 345US\$; 381 US\$ in the West Bank and 262 US\$ in Gaza Strip.
- Employees obtaining a Bachelor's degree and above in the Palestinian Territories registered the highest monthly salary with a rate of US\$ 708, of which US\$ 786 in the West Bank and US\$ 574 in Gaza (US\$ 815 for males compared to US\$ 535 for females), while the minimum wage rate was registered for those with less qualified (preparatory and less) with average payment of US\$ 380 (of which US\$ 425 in the West Bank and US\$ 275 in the Gaza Strip, and US\$ 412 of males and US\$ 261 of females).
- Results showed that the highest wage scored for users who have served 10 years or more (US\$ 669) of which US\$ 727 in the West Bank and US\$ 566 in Gaza Strip.

Compensation of Employees, November 2006

- The full-time employees compensations in November 2006 stood at US\$ to 559 of which US\$ 623 for males and US\$ 418 for females), and US\$ 629 in the West Bank and US\$ 424 in Gaza Strip.
- Results showed that the highest rate of compensation was paid to employees working
 in the financial sector, US\$ 873, (of which US\$ 905 in the West Bank and US\$ 755 in
 Gaza Strip), while the lowest rate of compensation was registered for employees
 working in the education sector, with a rate of US\$ 508 (US\$ 553 in the West Bank
 and US\$ 411 in Gaza).
- Results showed that the highest rate of wages was registered for employees working in legislators and top management with a rate of US\$ 1,041 of which US\$ 1,184 in the West Bank and US\$ 778 in Gaza Strip.

Working Hours in November 2006

- Results showed that the average weekly working hours of salaried employees reached 43.0 working hour; 43.1 hours for employees in the West Bank and 42.8 hours in Gaza Strip, while the average weekly working hours for salaried and wage earners employees reached 47.6 weekly working hours; 47.4 hours in the West Bank and 47.9 hours in Gaza Strip.
- On the other side, the results showed that 45.0 hours for males compared to 42.3 hours for females. Hotels and restaurants sector registered the highest average working hours (52.8 hours a week for males, and 56.7 hours for females), while the lowest average weekly working hours have been registered for education sector, (37.4 hours a week for males and 37.5 hours for females).
- Results showed that the average weekly working hours in establishments that employed 20 and more employees during November 2006 has reached 45.0 hours for males compared to 42.3 hours for females. Hotels and restaurants sector registered the highest average working hours (52.8 hours a week for males, and 56.7 hours for females), while the lowest average weekly working hours have been registered for education sector, (37.4 hours a week for males and 37.5 hours for females).
- Male workers in the operation of machinery, assembly workers and elementary occupations registered highest rate of weekly working hours, (of which 46.4 working hours for males and 42.3 hours for females)

• The Weekly working days stood at 5.7 days in the Palestinian Territory, of which 5.7 working days in the West Bank and 5.8 working days in Gaza Strip.

Paid Working Hours on November 2006:

- Results showed that the average paid working hours for employees, during October 2006, has reached 177 hours. Hotels and restaurants sector registered the highest average paid working hours (209 hours), followed by the trade sector (205 hours), and then the transport, storage and communications (203 hours). The lowest average monthly paid working hours was in the education sector (148 hours).
- In the West Bank, results showed that the average paid working hours during the same period of salaried employees has reached 178 hours. Hotels and restaurant services registered the highest paid working hours (208 hours), followed by transport, storage and communication (205 hours), and then the trade sector (203 hours), while education sector registered the lowest paid working hours (149 hours).
- In Gaza Strip, results showed that the average paid working hours during the same period of salaried employees has reached 174 hours. Hotels and restaurant services registered the highest paid working hours (213 hours), followed by trade sector (208 hours), and then real estate activities and rentals (196 hours), while education sector registered the lowest paid working hours (144 hours).
