



Data showed that the population of the Palestinian Territory is young; the percentage of persons in the age group (0-15) was 43.5% of the total population in the Palestinian Territory 2008, 40.8% in the West Bank and 47.9% in Gaza Strip. The elderly population aged (65 years and over) was 3.0% of the total Palestinian Territory population, 3.3% in the West Bank and 2.4% in Gaza Strip in the mid year 2008.

Crude birth rates declined in the Palestinian Territory during the period 1997 - 2008

Data shows that the crude birth rate in the Palestinian Territory dropped from 42.7 births per one thousand of the population in 1997 to 32.5 births in 2008. The crude birth rate in the West Bank was 30.6 births compared to 35.6 births in Gaza Strip in 2008.

The estimated number of Palestinians all over the world by mid 2008 was 10.5 million distributed as follows: 3.8 million in the Palestinian Territory (36.6%) of the total Palestinians all over the world; 1.2 million (11.5%) in Israel; 4.8 million (46.2%) in the Arab countries. The number of Palestinians living in foreign countries is estimated to be 599 thousand (5.7%) of the total Palestinians in the world.



The population of the Palestinian Territory was estimated about 3.8 million in mid year 2008, distributed as (62.3%) in the West Bank and (37.7%) in Gaza Strip

Data showed that the population of the Palestinian Territory is young; the percentage of individuals in the age group (0-15) was 43.5% of the total population in the Palestinian Territory in mid year 2008, The elderly population aged (65 years and over) was 3.0% of the total Palestinian Territory population in mid year 2008.

Data indicated that there is a fall in average family size in the Palestinian Territory, where the average family size fell to 5.8 persons in 2007 compared to 6.3 people in 1997. The average family size in the West Bank fell to 5.5 persons in 2007 compared to 6.0 per capita in 1997.

The registered marriages in the Palestinian Territory in 2007 reached 32,685 contracts. The number of marriages registered in 2007 in the West Bank reached 18,576 contracts, while the number of marriages registered in 2007 in the Gaza Strip reached 14,109 contracts.

The number of registered divorces in 2007 totaled 4,043 in the Palestinian Territory. The number of registered divorces in 2007 in the West Bank was 2,398, while the number of registered divorces in Gaza Strip, was 1,645.

The results of the census 2007 showed that 78.9% of all private households in the Palestinian Territory were nuclear households; in the West Bank 81.9% of private households were nuclear households were compared to 73.0% in the Gaza Strip. The extended household formation in the Palestinian Territory represented 16.4% of private households in 2007. The percentage of one person households and composite households in the Palestinian Territory for the same year were 3.5% and 0.1% respectively.

The labor force participation rate in the Palestinian Territory decreased in 2008 compared to 2007. The unemployment rate in the Palestinian Territory increased from 21.5% in 2007 to 26.0% in 2008; it increased sharply from 29.7% to 40.6% in Gaza Strip and increased noticeably from 17.7% to 19.0% in the West Bank.

#### Unemployed (According to ILO Standards):

Unemployed persons are those individuals (15 years and Above) who did not work at all during the reference week, who were not absent from a job and were available for work and actively seeking a job during the reference week. Persons who work in Israel and were absent from work due to closure are considered unemployed, and also those persons never worked and not looking for work but waiting to return back to their work in Israel and settlements.

#### Unemployed (According to Relaxed Definition):

The number of unemployed persons was calculated under the definition by adding to unemployed persons according to the ILO Standards, those persons outside labor force because they were frustrated.





Results revealed that unemployment is concentrated among the youth aged 15-24 years reaching 40.2%, followed by persons aged 25-34 years reaching 25.5% in 2008.

The results showed that more than one third of employed persons (38.4%) from the Palestinian Territory were employed in the services sector while 20.2% were employed in commerce, hotels and restaurants. The construction sector has been the most affected since 2000 with only 10.9% employed in 2008.


### Unemployment Rate of Participation Persons in Labor Force by Age Groups, 2008

Results indicated that in 2008 for employed persons distributed according to place of work were: 62.3% working in the West Bank, 26.1% working in Gaza Strip, and 11.6% working in Israel and the settlements.



### **Living Standards**

#### Concepts and Definitions:

Expenditure: Includes the following:

- Cash spent on purchase of goods and services for living purposes.
- The value of goods and services payments or part of payments received from the employer.

Cash expenditure spent as taxes (non-commercial or non-industrial), gifts, contributions, interests on debts and other non-consumption items.

Consumption: Includes the following:

- Cash spent on purchase of goods and services for living purposes.
- The value of goods and services payments or part of payments received from the employer.
- Own-produced goods and food, including consumed quantities during the recording period.
- Estimated rent value of the dwelling.

Deep Poverty line: It refers to the estimation of what covers household basic needs (shelters, clothes, and food).

Relative Poverty line: It refers to the estimation of poverty line that what covers the household basic needs (shelter, clothes, and food), in addition to other needs including health care, education, transportation, personal care, and housekeeping supplies. The poverty line has been adjusted to reflect the different consumptions of families based on their composition (household size and the number of children).

According to data presented in the above table, it is noticed that the level of living in the West Bank is better than in Gaza Strip. Data showed that the percentage of expenditure on food in the West Bank was 33.3% compared to 38.5% in Gaza Strip, while the cash expenditure on non-food from the total cash expenditure in West Bank and Gaza Strip were 66.7% and 61.5% respectively






The government runs a very small number of kindergartens, while the private sector is the main sponsor of this type of education.













Number of Licensed Road Vehicles in the Palestinian


Territory\*, 2003-2007

Territory,\* 2003, 2004, 2006









The results revealed that the number of workers in tourism establishments was 6,144 workers in 2007, of whom 1,783 workers were without compensation from employers and 4,361 were salaried and wage workers; the results showed there were 5.666 male and 478 female workers.

The average expenditure during a hotel guest visit was US\$ 1,475.6. The distribution of expenditure according to the mode of consumption during the hotel guests visit showed that US\$ 603.2 was spent on hotels and accommodations, US\$ 355.8 spent on shopping, US\$ 263.6 spent on food and drink, US\$ 151.2 on transportation and telecommunications, and US\$ 101.8 on other expenditures.



The data revealed that fruit trees constituted 63.5% of the cultivated area of the Palestinian Territory, while vegetables and field crops comprised 10.2% and 26.3% of the cultivated Palestinian areas, respectively. Data also indicated that there was a decrease in the number of cattle, sheep and chickens in 2006/2007, in comparison with the previous year, 2005/2006.

The total value of agriculture production amounted to US\$ 1,114 million. The cost of intermediate consumption amounted to US\$ 617.6 million, and the value added of agriculture production amounted to US\$ 496.2 million.











#### Average Housing Density in the Palestinian Territory, 2003-2007





Data indicated that 16.4% of the households in the Palestinian Territory lived in housing units with 1-2 rooms in year 2007.





The number of martyrs in the Palestinian Territory by the end of 2008 reached 5,901 martyrs, of whom 2,162 martyrs were from the West Bank and 3,702 martyrs from Gaza Strip. There were 16 martyrs during the period 29/9/2000 - 31/12/2008 from outside the Palestinian Territory, and 21 martyrs from the 1948 area. Most of the martyrs were in Gaza Governorate (1,124 martyrs), then in North Gaza Governorate (1,008 martyrs). It is also noted that the year 2002 was the bloodiest year in the Intifada, which left 1,192 martyrs.
