The estimated number of Palestinians all over the world at end of year 2010 was 11 million distributed as follows: 4.1 million in the Palestinian Territory (37.5% of the total Palestinians all over the world); 1.4 million (12.4%) in Israel; 4.9 million (44.4%) in the Arab countries. The number of Palestinians living in foreign countries was estimated to be 627 thousand (5.7%) of the total Palestinians in the world.

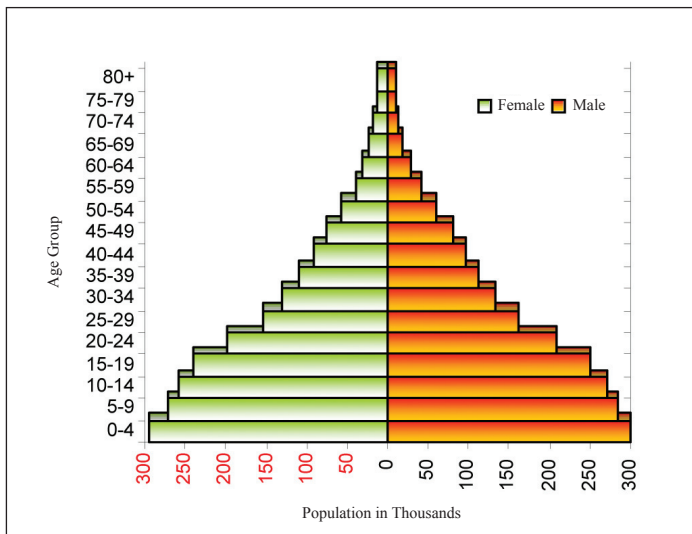

Crude birth rate has declined in the Palestinian Territory during the period 1997 - 2010:

Data showed that the crude birth rate in the Palestinian Territory has dropped from 42.7 births per one thousand of the population in 1997 to 32.8 births in 2010. The crude birth rate in the West Bank was 30.1 births compared to 37.1 births in Gaza Strip in 2010.

Data showed that the population of the Palestinian Territory is young; the percentage of individuals in the age group (0-14) was 41.3% of the total population in the Palestinian Territory at end year of 2010. The elderly population aged (65 years and over) was 3.0% of the total population in Palestinian Territory at end year of 2010. Data showed that the population of the Palestinian Territory is young; the percentage of persons in the age group (0-14) was 41.3% of the total population in the Palestinian Territory at end year of 2010; of which 39.4% in the West Bank and 44.4% in Gaza Strip.

Data indicated that there is a decrease in the average household's size in the Palestinian Territory, where the average size was 5.8 person in 2007 compared with 6.3 in 1997. The average household's size in the West Bank was 5.5 person in 2007 compared with 6.0 in 1997, while in Gaza Strip, the average size was 6.5 person in 2007 compared with 6.9 in 1997.

Data indicated that 85.8% of all private households in the Palestinian Territory were nuclear households in 2010. As for the West Bank, 84.5% of private households were nuclear compared to 88.7% in Gaza Strip. The extended households in the Palestinian Territory represented 11.0% of private households in 2010. The percentage of one-person households in the Palestinian Territory for the same year was 3.1%.

The labor force participation rate in the Palestinian Territory decreased in 2010 to 41.1% compared with 41.6% in 2009.

Unemployment rate in the Palestinian Territory decreased from 24.5% in 2009 to 23.7% in 2010. It decreased from 38.6% to 37.8% in Gaza Strip and from 17.8 % to 17.2% in the West Bank.

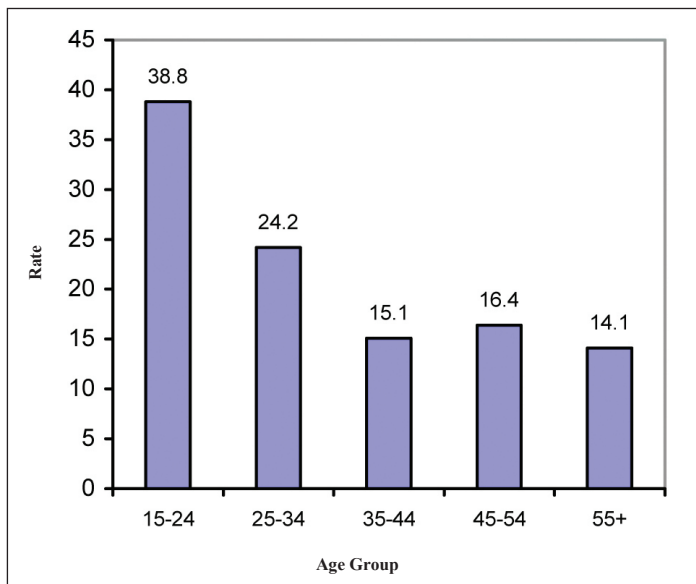
Unemployment (According to the Relaxed Definition):

Palestinian Territory by Age Groups, 2010**



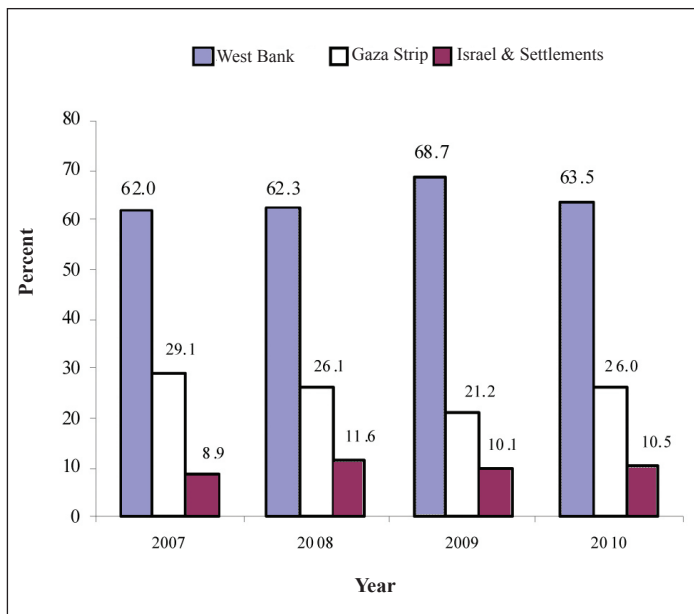
Results revealed that unemployment is concentrated among the youth aged 15-24 years, 38.8%, followed by persons aged 25-34 years, 24.2% in 2010.

More than one third of employed persons (38.3%) in the Palestinian Territory were employed in the services sector; while 19.3% were employed in commerce, hotels and restaurants. About 13.2% of employed persons were in the construction sector in 2010.

Results indicated that employed persons in 2010 distributed by place of work were as follows: 63.5% were working in the West Bank, 26.0% were working in Gaza Strip, and 10.5% were working in Israel and the settlements.

Levels of Living



Levels of Living

Concepts and Definitions:

Expenditure: *It refers to the amount of Cash spent on purchase of goods and services for living purposes, and the value of goods and services payments or part of payments received from the employer; and Cash expenditure spent as taxes (non-commercial or non-industrial), gifts, contributions, interests on debts and other non-consumption items.*

Consumption: It refers to the amount of Cash spent on purchase of goods and services for living purposes, and the value of goods and service payments or part of payments received from the employer, and own-produced goods and food, including consumed quantities during the recording period, and Imputed rent.

Poverty statistics are based on the official definition of poverty developed in 1997. The definition combines absolute and relative features and it is based on a budget of household basic needs. Two poverty lines were developed according to actual expenditure levels of Palestinian households; the first, termed “deep poverty line”; and the second is the “poverty line”.

In 2009 and 2010, there was a change in the composition of households in the Palestinian society; to reflect this change, instead of 2 adults and 4 children as the previous reference household, the reference household became 2 adults and 3 children (which was the most frequent household composition).

Poverty Gap: gives the percentage by which the average income of the poor is below the poverty line.

Poverty severity: gives the mean of the squared consumption deficits.

Data showed that the percentage of consumption on food for per capita in the West Bank was 34.0% compared to 37.3% in Gaza Strip for 2009. As for 2010, data showed that the percentage of consumption on food for per capita in the West Bank was 33.8% compared to 40.8% in Gaza Strip.

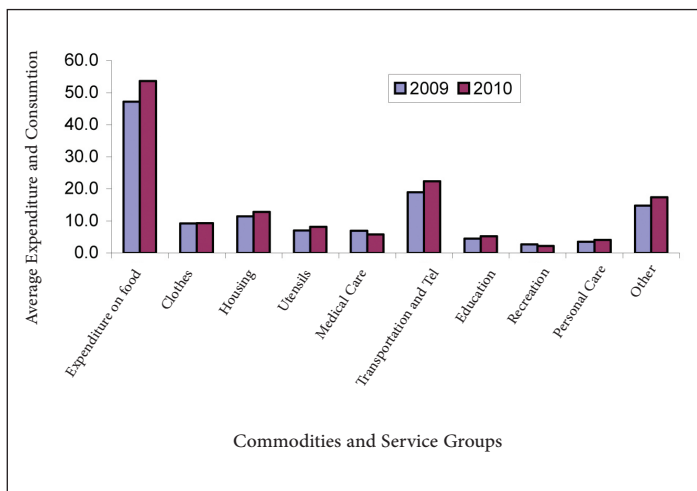

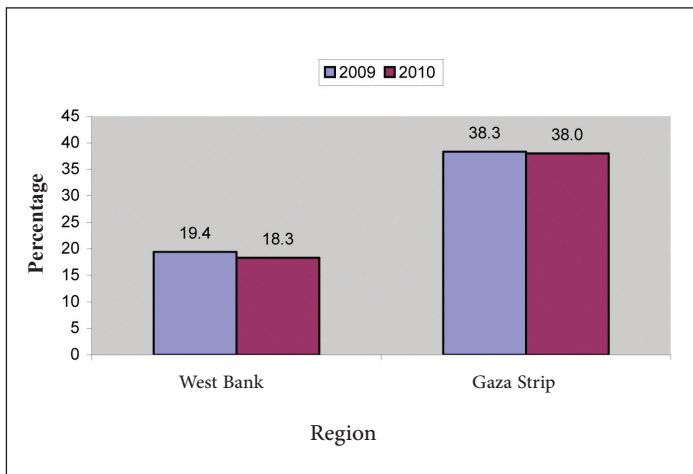

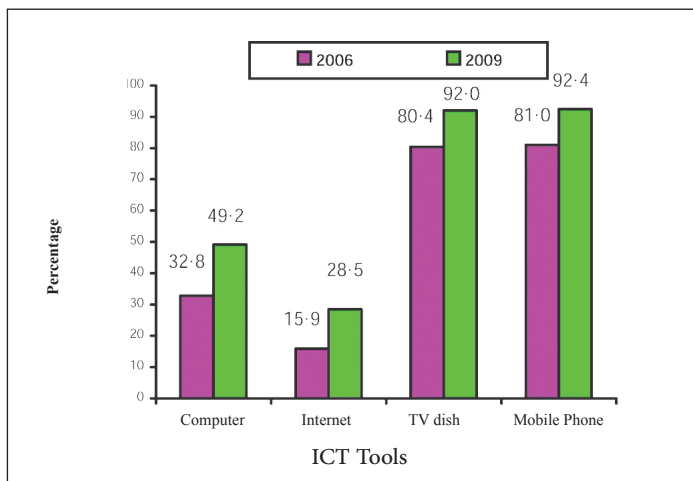

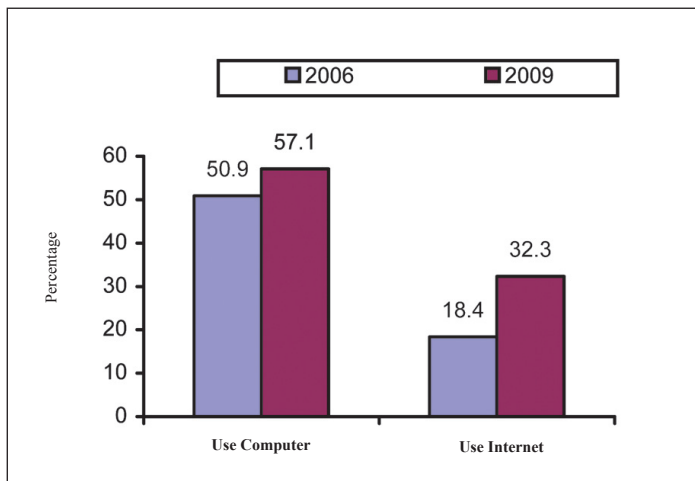

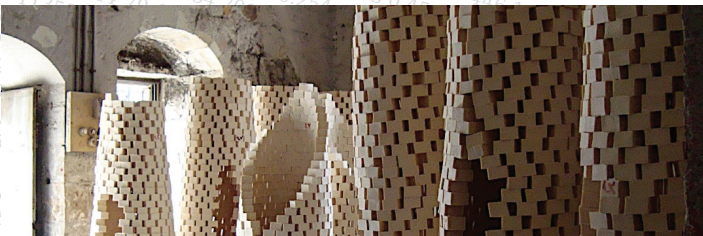

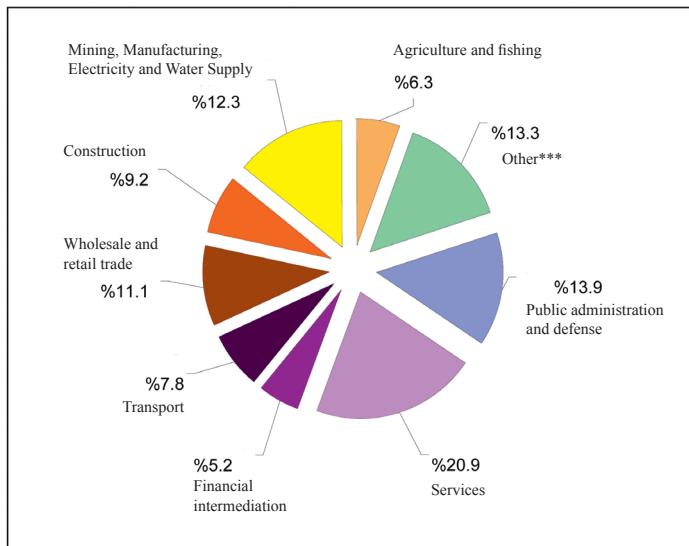

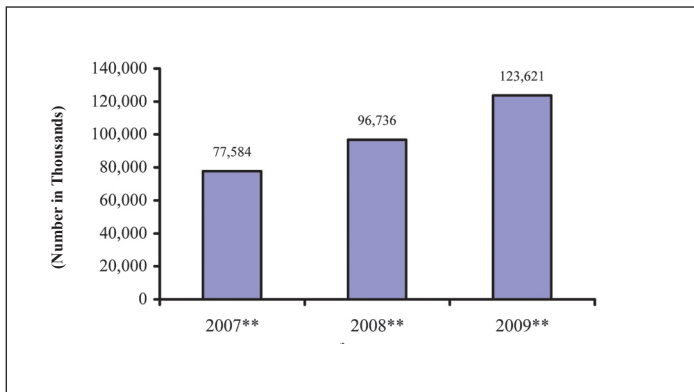

2007-2009**

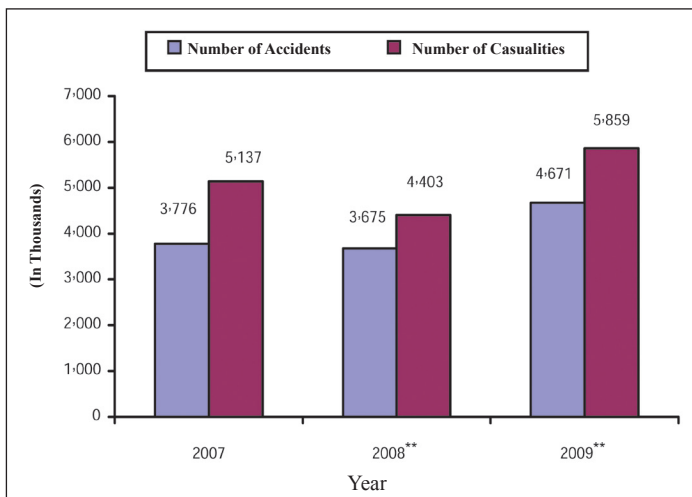

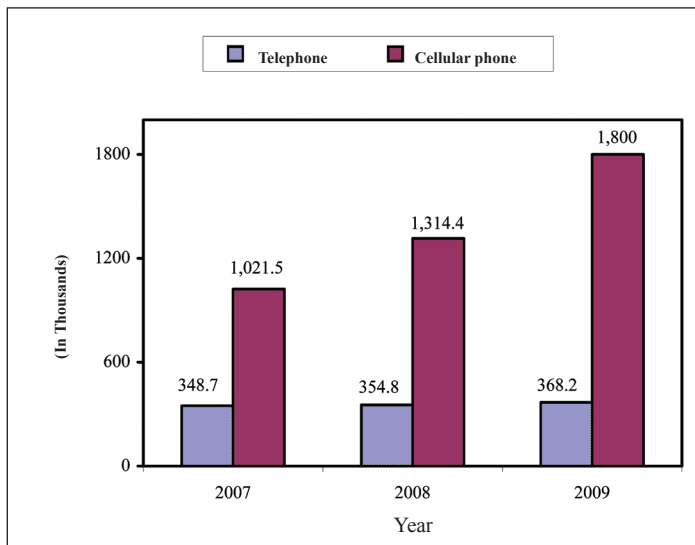
Number of Registered Road Accidents and Casualties in Palestinian Territory* By Year, 2007-2009

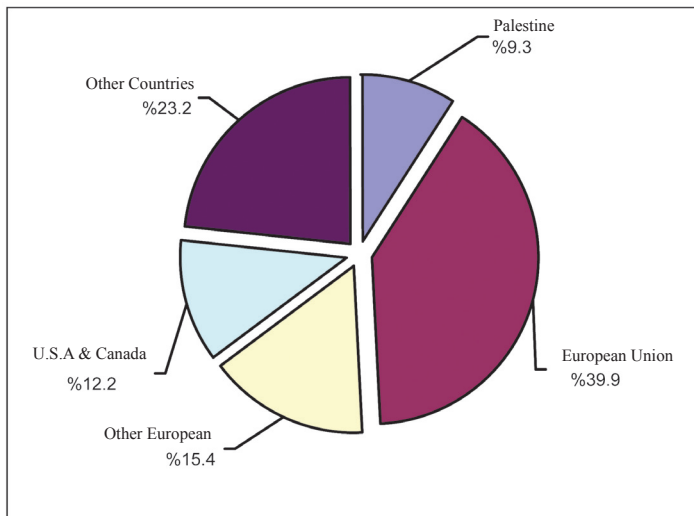

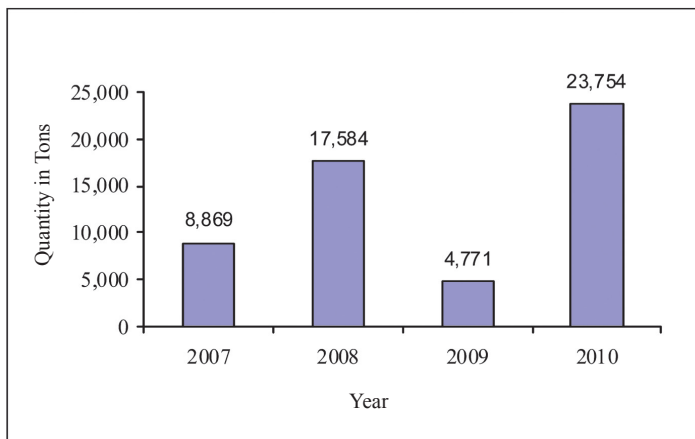

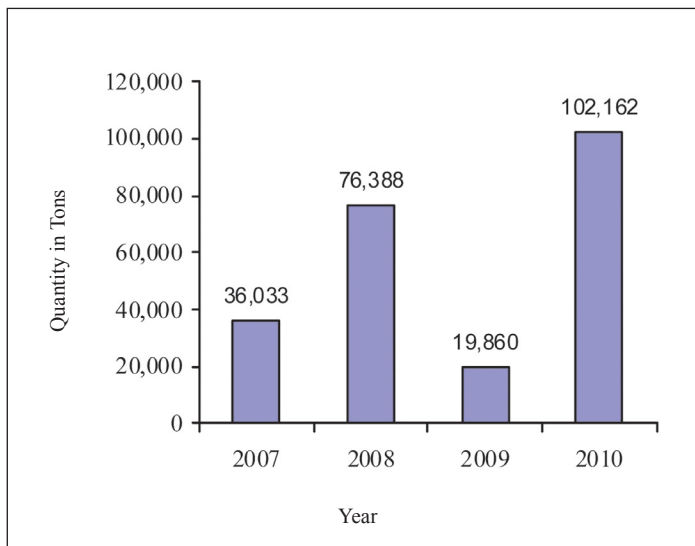

According to 2009 data, the number of Settlements in the West Bank totaled 144. Data showed that most of these settlements were in Jerusalem Governorate (26 settlements) of which 16 settlements were in the annexed parts of Jerusalem (J1). 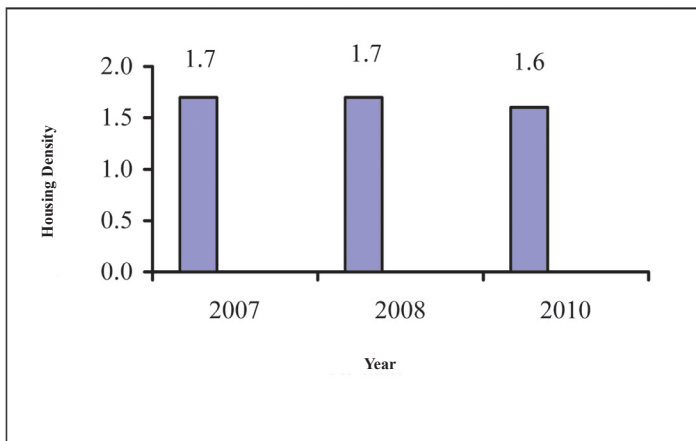

The Palestinian Territory, 2007-2010**

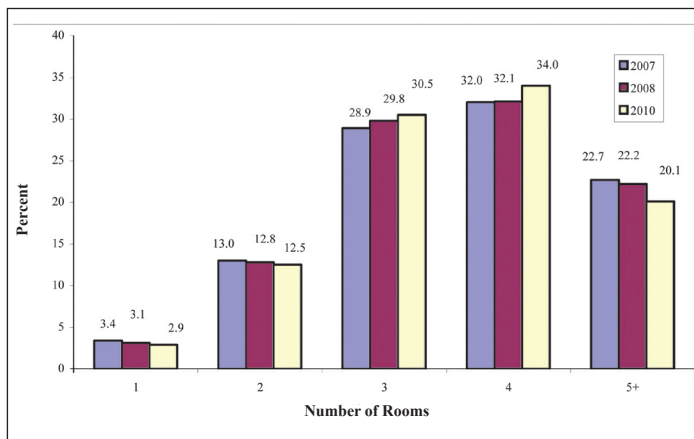
