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Press Release on Labour Force Survey Results (July- September, 2010) Round

Unemployment rate was the highest in Hebron governorate among the West Bank Governorates, while Khan Younis Governorate was the highest among Gaza Strip governorates

This report is based on the labour force quarterly survey. Data was collected during 04/07/2010 to 03/10/2010, representing the 3^{rd} quarter of 2010. The data of this round was compared with the data of the 2^{nd} quarter of 2010 and the 3^{rd} quarter of 2009.

The survey sample of this round is based on the 2007 census-sampling frame; 7,819 households were selected to represent the Palestinian society of which 6,812 households completed the questionnaires (4,656 in the West Bank and 2,156 in Gaza Strip).

Economically Active:

• According to the ILO standards, the labour force participation rate in the Palestinian Territory during the 3rd quarter of 2010 reached (40.5%) compared with (41.5%) in the 2nd quarter 2010 (while it reached 41.6% during the 3rd quarter of 2009). The participation rate of women reached (14.0%) in the 3rd quarter of 2010 compared with 15.2% in the 2nd quarter 2010, while the percentage for males reached 66.4% in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 67.1% in the 2nd quarter 2010.

Unemployed Persons

- According to the relaxed definition of unemployment, the percentage of persons who don't work regardless of seeking or not seeking jobs, increased from 28.6% in the 2nd quarter 2010 to 33.3% in the 3rd quarter of 2010, compared with 31.4% in the 3rd quarter 2009.
- According to the ILO standards, the percentage of persons who don't work, but seeking jobs increased between the 2nd quarter 2010 and the 3rd quarter of 2010. The results showed that the percentage of the unemployed increased from 22.9% in the 2nd quarter 2010 to 26.6% in the 3rd quarter of 2010, as compared with 25.8% in the 3rd quarter of 2009. The unemployment rate increased in Gaza Strip from 39.3% in the 2nd quarter 2010 to 40.5% in the 3rd quarter of 2010, also in the West Bank increased from 15.2% in the 2nd quarter 2010 to 20.1% in the 3rd quarter of 2010.
- Hebron governorate has the highest unemployment rate among the West Bank governorates (25.0%) followed by Bethlahem governorate at (24.7%); while Jerusalem governorate has the lowest unemployment rate (13.3%). For Gaza Strip, Khan Younis governorate has the highest unemployment rate (46.2%) followed by North Gaza governorate (41.8%), then Deir AlBalah governorate (41.5%).
- The results showed that the highest unemployment rate was concentrated among youth aged 15-29; the age group 20-24 has the highest unemployment rate and reached 44.6%, distributed as 34.3% in the West Bank and 65.7% in Gaza Strip, followed by age group 15-19 which reached 37.5%, distributed as 28.6% in the West Bank and 72.0% in Gaza Strip, then 25-29 group with 33.2%, distributed as 26.5% in the West Bank and 44.5% in Gaza Strip.
- he results showed that the highest unemployment rate in the 3rd quarter 2010 was concentrated among youth females aged 20-29; the age group 20-24 has the highest unemployment rate and reached 62.3% compared with 39.9% for males, followed by age group 25-29 which reached 51.8%, compared with 28.2% for males.
- The results showed that unemployment rate among females who completed 1-6 years of schooling was 5.2%; whereas, this percentage reached 41.6% for females completed 13 years of

schooling and more as compared with 19.3% among males. The highest rate was among males who completed 1-6 years of schooling at 30.6%.

Employed Persons

- The results showed a decrease in the number of employed persons between the 2nd quarter 2010, and 3rd quarter of 2010 by 46 thousand employees. The number of employed persons reached 710 thousand in the 3rd quarter of 2010 as compared with 756 thousand in the 2nd quarter 2010. The results also showed a decrease in employed women from 134 thousand to 112 thousand between the 2nd quarter 2010 and 3rd quarter of 2010, the number of employed women in The West Bank decreased from 110,500 worked woman to 101,100 Woman, also the number in Gaza Strip decreased from 23,200 to 19,600 in the same period.
- At economic activity¹ level, the results showed that the percentage of those who have worked in agriculture sector in the West Bank was 11.6% in the 3rd quarter of 2010 compared with 15.4% in the 2nd quarter 2010; while the percentage of those who have worked in mining, quarrying and manufacturing increased from 13.3% in the 2nd quarter of 2010 to 14.0% in 3rd quarter 2010. The percentage of those who worked in construction sector was 11.6% in the 3rd quarter of 2010 compared with 12.3% in the 2nd quarter 2010. For Gaza Strip, the percentage of those who have worked in agriculture sector was 8.0% in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 7.8% in the 2nd quarter of 2010; while the percentage of employed persons in commerce, restaurants and hotels sector was 16.2% in the 3rd quarter of 2010 compared with 16.8% in the 2nd quarter 2010. On the other hand, the results showed that the percentage of employed persons in services sector reached 35.5% in the West Bank and 60.0% in Gaza Strip in the 3rd quarter of 2010.
- The results showed that the percentage of wage employees in the West Bank was 64.9% in the 3rd quarter of 2010 compared with 62.3% in the 2nd quarter 2010; while the percentage of unpaid family members was 7.9% compared with 9.8% in the same period. Also the percentage of self employed person was 20.2% in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 20.6% in the 2nd quarter 2010.
- For Gaza Strip, the percentage of wage employees was 79.1% in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 80.0% in the 2nd quarter 2010; while the percentage of unpaid family members was 1.7% in the 2nd quarter 2010; and reached 2.2% in the 3rd quarter of 2010. The percentage of self employed was 14.0% in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 13.6% in the 2nd quarter 2010.
- Employment in Israel and Israeli settlements from the West Bank reached 14.2% in the 3rd quarter of 2010, (distributed 38.8% have permit, 17.3% do not have permit, 43.9% persons who have Israeli Identity or foreign passport); whereas in Gaza Strip there was no access for workers to enter Israel or Israeli settlements.
- The results showed that employment the public sector constitutes about one fourth (24.7%) of the total employed person, distributed as 16.9% in the West Bank and 47.0% in Gaza Strip.

Wages and Work Hours

- The average value of the nominal daily net wage of employees worked in the West Bank increased from 84.1 NIS in the 2nd quarter 2010 to 86.6 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2010; while in Gaza Strip, the nominal daily net wage of employees remains at the same level 58.0 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 58.1 NIS in the 2nd quarter 2010. For nominal daily net wage for those working in Israel and Israeli settlements was 154.7 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 155.5 NIS in the 2nd quarter 2010, compared with 147.7 NIS in the 3rd quarter 2009.
- The average weekly work hours in the West Bank reached 43.4 work hours in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 43.6 work hours in the 2nd quarter 2010; and in Gaza Strip was 39.9 work hours in the 3rd quarter 2010 compared with 38.8 work hours in the 2nd quarter 2010. The average weekly work hours for those working in Israel and Israeli settlements remains at the same average 39.4 work hours for the same period.

Working benefits:

- Results about wage employees in the private sector showed that only 26.2% of them have a contribution to the pension fund; while 28.7% of wage employees have annual paid leave, and 50.4% of women have a maternity paid leave.
- Results of the 3rd quarter 2010 in the Palestinian Territory showed that 29.7% of workers in the private sector were hired by contract distributed as 28.2% in the West Bank and 34.3% in Gaza Strip.
- The results of second quarter 2010 in the Palestinian Territory also showed that 19.0% of wage employees were affiliated to a vocational union distributed as 18.7% in the West Bank compared with 19.7% in Gaza Strip.

Concepts and Definitions

Man power

All persons in the West Bank and Gaza Strip aged 15 years and over.

Reference week:

The week ending on Friday preceding the interviewer's visit to the household.

Employed:

All persons are 15 years and over who were working at a paid job or business for at least one hour during the reference week, or who did not work, but held a job or owned business from which they were temporarily absent (because of illness, vacation, temporarily stoppage, or any other reason) during the reference week. Employed persons are classified according to employment status as follows:

- 1. Employer
- 2. Self-employed
- 3. Employee
- 4. Unpaid family member

Unemployed (According to the ILO Standards):

Unemployed persons are those individuals 15 years and over who did not work at all during the reference week, who were not absent from a job and were available for work and actively seeking a job during the reference week. Persons who work in Israel and were absent from work due to closure are considered unemployed, and also those persons never work and not looking for work but waiting to return back to their works in Israel and Settlements.

Unemployed (According to the Relaxed Definition):

The number of unemployed persons was calculated under the relaxed definition by adding to unemployed persons according to the ILO Standards, those persons outside labour force because they were frustrated

Labour force:

The economically active population (Labour Force) consists of all persons 15 years and over who are either employed or unemployed as defined above at the time of survey.

Underemployment:

Underemployment exists when a person's employment is inadequate in relation to alternative employment, account being taken of his/her occupational skills.

Persons outside labour force:

The population not economically active comprises all persons 15 years and over, who were neither employed nor unemployed accordingly to the definitions above.
