On the Main Findings of the Survey on the Perception of Palestinian Population Towards the Socioeconomic Conditions, January 2005

"Although the Palestinians still suffering from the current Israeli measures, Most of Palestinian families indicate optemesic attitude at the short and median term level"

PCBS conducted the 10th round of the survey on the perception of the Palestinian people about the socioeconomic conditions. Data collection took place during the period 2/1/2005-22/1/2005 on a sample composed of 2,964 households, (1,872 in the West Bank and 1,092 in Gaza Strip).

Current Situation

39.9% of interviewed persons reported that the overall well-being of their households is worse in January 2005 compared with a month ago (38.1% in the West Bank and 43.0% in Gaza Strip), while 13.1% reported that it is better (14.9% in the West Bank and 10.1% in Gaza Strip).

19.1% of the households reported that the ability of households' members to move around is easier this week compared with a week ago (24.5% in the West Bank and 10.2% in Gaza Strip), while 11.9% reported that it is harder.

Short-Term Expectations:

The 10th round, (January 2005) showed that there is an optimism expectation in the well being of households at the short run. About 42.2% of the respondents expected that overall well being of the households will be better (39.4% in the West Bank and 46.7% in Gaza Strip), while the expectation during the 9th round, (October 2004), was 21.2% (19.2% in the West Bank and 24.1% in Gaza Strip)

34.1% of interviewed persons expected that the ability of households' members to move around will be better next month compared with interviewing week (36.0% in the West Bank and 30.9% in Gaza Strip), while the expectation during the 9th round, (October 2004), was 16.9% (14.2% in the West Bank and 20.9% in Gaza Strip).

40.2% of interviewed persons reported that they are very optimistic to find a job next month, of which 50.7% in the West Bank and 59.1% in Gaza Strip.

Mid-Term Expectations:

The 10th round showed that there is an optimism expectation in the well being of households at the mid-term run. About 46.8% of the respondents expected that overall well-being of households will be better in six months time (43.7% in the West Bank and 52.0% in Gaza Strip), while the expectation during the 9th round, (October 2004), was 22.9% (19.9% in the West Bank and 27.3% in Gaza Strip).

37.9% of interviewed persons reported that the ability of household members to move around will be better in six months time compared with interviewing week (39.4% in the West Bank and 35.4% in Gaza Strip), while the expectation during the 9th round, (October 2004), was 18.1% (13.9% in the West Bank and 24.4 in Gaza Strip).

Priorities of households:

Data reveal that 48.7% of the households reported the need for food as a first priority, 18.3% the need for work, 15.7% the need for financial assistance, and 6.7% reported the need for educational services, while 4.9% reported the need for health services as a first priority.

Priority Needs of Communities:

About 59.8% of households reported the need for job creation opportunities, and 15.0% reported the need for developing infrastructure services, and 6.6% for providing health services.
