Ramallah – **13/09/2017** – The Palestinian Central Bureau of Statistics (PCBS) organized a Donors Meeting with the cooperation of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the participation of Representatives from the donor community, UN Agencies and International Institutions to discuss the recent developments on the Population, Housing and Establishments Census 2017 in addition to exploring means of possible cooperation and support for the project.
