The estimated global population of Palestinians at the end of 2011 was 11.2 million distributed as follows: 4.2 million in the Palestinian Territory (61.8% in the West Bank and 38.2% in Gaza Strip and representing 37.7% of the global Palestinian population); 1.4 million (12.2%) in Israel; and 5.0 million (44.4%) in Arab countries. The number of Palestinians living in foreign countries was estimated to be 0.6 million (5.7%) of the global Palestinian population.

Estimated Population in the Palestinian Territory by Region and Sex, End 2011



The crude birth rate in the Palestinian Territory rose from 32.7 births per one thousand of the population in 2009 to 32.8 births in 2011. The crude birth rate in the West Bank was 30.1 births per one thousand of the population compared to 37.2 births in Gaza Strip.

Data show that the population of the Palestinian Territory is young: the percentage of individuals in the 0-14 year age group was 40.7% of the total population at the end of 2011: 38.6% in the West Bank and 43.8% in Gaza Strip.

Data indicated that the size of the average household size in the Palestinian Territory did not change in the period 2009-2011. The average household size in the West Bank was 5.6 persons in 2011 compared with 5.5 in 2010, while in Gaza Strip the average size was 6.3 persons in 2011 compared with 6.4 in 2010.

Data indicated that 82.1% of all private households in the Palestinian Territory were nuclear households in 2010. In the West Bank, 82.2% of private households were nuclear compared to 81.8% in Gaza Strip. Extended households represented 14.2% of private households in 2010 while the percentage of one-person households in the Palestinian Territory for the same year was 3.6%.

The labor force participation rate in the Palestinian Territory rose to 43.0% in 2011 compared to 41.1% in 2010.

The unemployment rate in the Palestinian Territory fell from 23.7% in 2010 to 20.9% in 2011. It fell from 37.8% to 28.7% in Gaza Strip and rose from 17.2% to 17.3% in the West Bank.


The number of unemployed persons was calculated under the relaxed definition by adding those persons outside the labor force (because they were

Unemployment Rate of Persons Participating in Labor Force in the Palestinian Territory by Age Groups, 2011




In 2011, unemployment was concentrated among youth aged 15-24 years with 35.7%, followed by persons aged 25-34 years with 21.8%.

More than one third of employed persons (36.0%) in the Palestinian Territory were employed in the services sector and 20.3% were employed in commerce, hotels and restaurants. About 13.9% of employed persons worked in the construction sector in 2011.

According to the data presented above, the standard of living in the West Bank is higher than in Gaza Strip. The percentage of food consumption per capita in the West Bank was 34.0% compared to 37.3% in Gaza Strip for 2009. For 2010, the percentage of food consumption per capita in the West Bank was 33.8% compared to 40.8% in Gaza Strip.










Percentage of Households with ICT Equipment in the Palestinian Territory, 2009, 2011



The percentage of households with a computer in the Palestinian Territory was 50.9% in 2011 compared with 49.2% in 2009. In addition, 30.4% of households had an Internet connection in 2011 compared with 28.5% in 2009. The percentage of households that own a TV satellite dish in the Palestinian Territory was 93.9% in 2011 compared with 92.0% in 2009. In 95.0% of Palestinian households, at least one member possessed a mobile phone in 2011 compared with 92.4% in 2009.

The data showed that 53.7% of persons aged 10 years and above used a computer in the Palestinian Territory in 2011. In addition, 39.6% of persons 10 years and above used Internet in 2011.






Number of Licensed Road Vehicles in the Palestinian Territory* by Region, 2010







It also includes the number of farm bred animals (sheep, goats and cows) on the enumeration day 1/10/2010. The results indicated that plant holdings constituted 71.1% of all holdings in the Palestinian Territory while animal holdings constituted 12.8% and mixed holdings 16.1%. 
